

## GPA Conversion Chart

### 1. Calculate your Princeton GPA using on the instructions provided on the Registrar’s website:

<https://registrar.princeton.edu/student-and-alumni-services/transcript-and-verification-services/calculate-your-gpa>

### 2. Round your GPA:

- If your GPA is less than 3.95, round to one decimal place using standard rounding rules:
  - 3.74 → 3.7
  - 3.75 → 3.8
- If your GPA is between 3.95 and 3.99, round to two decimal places:
  - 3.951 → 3.95
  - 3.972 → 3.97 (This is in order to be fair to students with a 4.0 GPA)

### 3. How to report your GPA on your resume: You must include your actual GPA along with the conversion using this exact phrasing:

English-language resume:

**“Grade Point Average: 3.3 (USA) ≈ 1,7(Germany)”**

German-language resume:

**“Notendurchschnitt: 3.3 (USA) ≈ 1,7(Deutschland)”**

*(In Germany, commas are used for decimal points)*
